Throughout the week, we are very lucky to be supported in Class Three by Mrs Beck and Mrs Midgley. **Mrs Beck** will teach your children **French, Music and R.E** on a **Thursday Morning**.

Please can children bring in the following items every day:

- **Named water bottles** The children can access their water bottle throughout the day and they will change their water regularly.
- **Book bags**
- **Reading book and record**
- **Warm, waterproof coats!**

P.E will be on a **Tuesday** and **Wednesday Morning**. Please can all long hair be tied up and earrings removed on these days. Please can all children have their full P.E kit (including labelled t-shirt, shorts and pumps) in school all term. This kit will be sent home at half-term to be washed!

Each week children will have set **homework** that will reinforce work that the children have already been taught. Homework will be given out on a **Thursday** to be returned the following **Thursday**. All children will receive **Phonics** and half termly **Topic** homework. This is also available on our website in case you need it. Of course, the children will be expected to read their reading books as often as possible. Reading books are changed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Mrs Croll (our lovely Class Three volunteer) will read with the children on a Wednesday afternoon, so children need their books in on this day. It is very important homework is completed for further practice and returned back to school in their homework folders.

As you know, all the children are now in the teams: **Courage, Honour, Respect and Trust**. Please remember your badges every day!
