We will be learning all about **Beatrix Potter** and **Peter Rabbit** in our English lessons too.



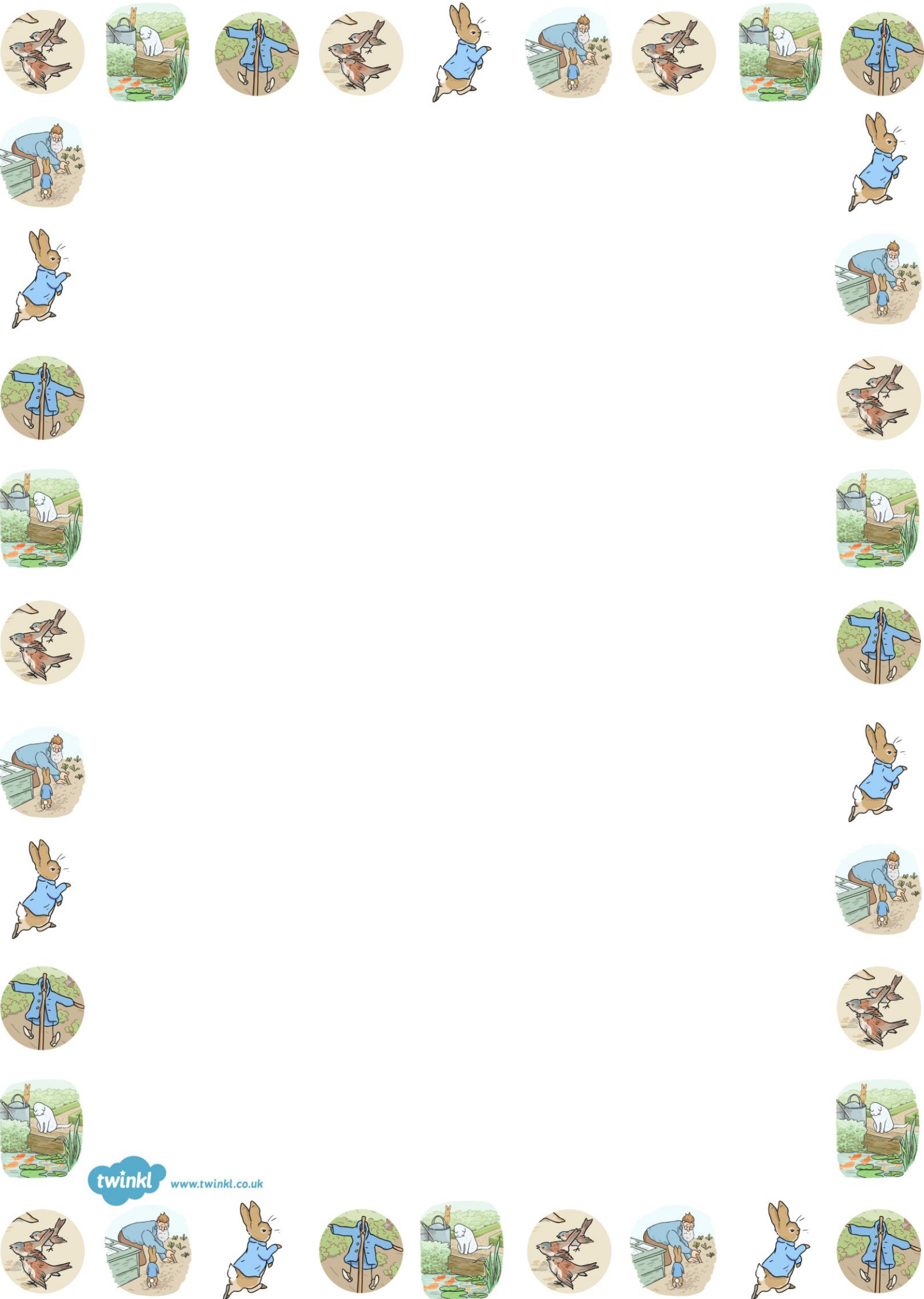
These homework activities are to be completed at your own leisure over this half term, however we would love you to complete task 1 and choose 3 of the other tasks. We would love to see your ideas and designs please bring them into school on completion. There is no wrong or right way of completing the tasks! Have some fun and enjoy learning about **Explorers** with KS1.

1. Imagine you are a great explorer. What countries do you want to explore? Look at a world map. Can you plan your travels? Present your work in whichever way you like.
2. Go and explore a new place! Take a picture so we can all see!
3. Bring a picture of you in a place you have explored. It could be in England or another country. We will put it up on our classroom display.
4. Research the life of a famous explorer or discoverer, e.g. Sir Francis Drake. Present your work in whichever way you like. How are they remembered?
5. Write a story about going on a journey. What exciting things will you find, see, hear and feel?
6. Can you become a wildlife explorer and make a list of the animals and insects you find in your garden or the park. If you don't find any, you could write a list of the ones you think might live there.
7. Use a map to find a different country. It might be a place you have visited. Create the flag for this country.
8. Can you read a Beatrix Potter/Peter Rabbit Club book? Read it at home with someone in your family. Write about what you like about the story.
9. Peter and his friends live in cosy rabbit burrows underground. Can you make your own burrow? Try draping a big blanket across four chairs and burrowing underneath with your family and friends. If you are feeling brave, you could even try and make a burrow outside!

Don't forget: every secret hiding place needs secret snacks! Ask a grown up to help you prepare some juicy radishes or crunchy carrots to share in your burrow. Take a picture or draw your burrow to show the class.

10. Make a 3D model of a Beatrix Potter character. You can use any material you would like!
11. Can you and your friends or family run as fast as Peter Rabbit? Try these rabbit races ideas. Radish and spoon race: An egg and spoon race with a twist! Balance a radish on the spoon and try to get to the end of the race without dropping it! Peter's jumping race: A race with a catch... you have to keep your feet together! Pick a start and finish line, then jump to the end!











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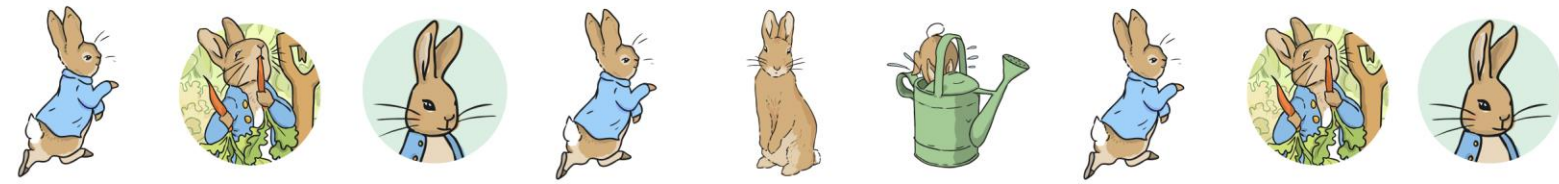
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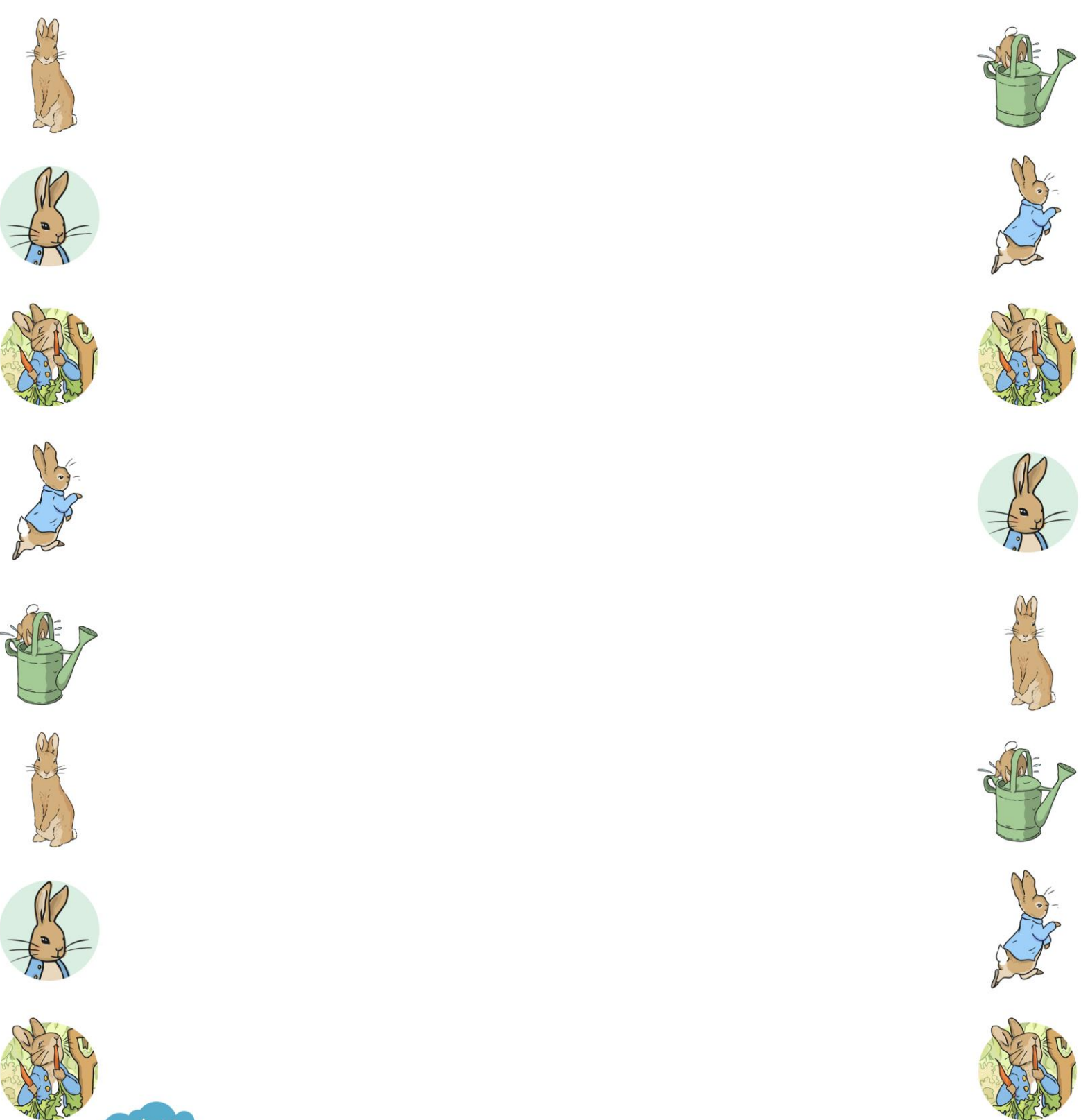
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
